Defendant wins case after judge finds reasonable doubt

This became obvious when the llowing cases were heard in are County District Court on Friy, March 5. Judge Edgar L. arnes presided with Eula Reid osecuting for the state.

On October 10, 1998, officer ris Merithew, formerly with the anteo Police Department and rrently serving with the Nags ead Police Department, arrived the Trade Mart in Manteo folwing an assault. Once on the ene he found the defendant, ouis Parsons, 35, of Wanchese, ng in a pool of blood in the rking lot. His empty Chevrolet n was 30 feet away, still in gear d grinding away in the sand.

Officer Merithew said Parsons elled of alcohol and had a seris head wound. He had the fendant transported to Outer nks Medical Center for treat-

Upon inspection of the van. en alcohol containers were ind throughout the front of the nicle. Merithew then traveled to

BMC to question Parsons.

After questioning Parsons, it remained unclear as to just who was driving the vehicle at the time of the accident. Parsons stated that he was giving someone a ride that evening and that this person assaulted him in the parking lot, resulting in his injury. However, Parsons refused to press charges or name the assailant.

After five attempts to draw blood for alcohol testing, Merithew brought Parsons to headquarters for an Intoxilyzer test, which registered twice above the legal limit. Parson's attorney, Kris Felthousen, attributed the reading to his client's low blood count and the medication he had received while under treatment.

After the defense attorney's final statement, in which it was argued that the state had not met its responsibility to prove beyond a reasonable doubt the defendant's guilt, Judge Barnes found Parsons not guilty of driving while impaired and possession of an open container after first consuming alcohol.
